

JRAAR Q2 2022 Meeting Minutes

Treasurer's Report

- We brought in \$14,775.92 up 155% from Q2 last year
- We spent \$12,293.73 up 60% from Q2 last year

Animal Outcomes

- We brought in 530 Animals up 70% from Q2 last year
- We adopted out 361 up 157% from Q2 last year

Events

Fundraisers

Our garage sale brought in \$1482 and was a huge success.

Surrender Events

We had events in Madison, Stevens Point, Waupun and La Crosse. We had a combined 175 animals surrendered, 180 people attended, and had a reach of 92K people on Facebook.

Director's Goals for 2022

- Move adoption center into a storefront
 - Recruit a staff of volunteers which can help with animal care and building maintenance
 - We can be open to the public which will increase adoptions and sales
- Hire a director
 - Having an employee on staff, either full or part-time, will remove distractions and increase accountability for the shelter instead of relying on volunteers 100%
 - Should be able to get grants to pay for some payroll when it comes to invasive species work

New Business

We had the surrender of over 120 reptiles from a storage locker in Waukesha. Discussed changing the quarantine period from 2 weeks to 1 week, and made that change.

We discussed moving J&R Aquatic Animal Rescue to 200 Main Street in Neenah, WI. We contacted the City of Neenah and got all our permits in line. The property was leased to someone else while we were navigating the red tape.

Will continue looking for a property in the meantime.
